





Work done & achievements of Organization activity

- Increases for land fertile and irrigation of more than 1600Ha due to work done under Galmukt dharan Galyukta shivar Abhiyan through Dam De-siltation activity in 68 dams in Vidarbha region.
- Under Nala Deepening and Widening activity deepen and widened 99,000 Mtrs of Nala, stored 19,35,000 Cum of water in Doha created that covered 5845 hector of farm land of 9967 farmers from 45 villages.
- Plantation of trees more than 375000 of traditional tree plant in farmers land, barren land and surrounding of RWH structures in Yavatmal, Amravati, Gondia, Bhandara, Wardha and Chandrapur districts.
- Promoted 22 Farmers Producer Companies in Vidarbha region for crop productivity enhancement and joint marketing.
- Promoted more than 700 SHG's, credit linked, developed more than 2000 kitchen gardens and distributed 1229LPG connections to women's beneficiaries.
- Imparted training to 700 women's in poultry rearing and more than 600 women's started poultry rearing in their courtyards for initiation of income generation activities.
- Imparted training to 500 women's in goat rearing and more than 360 women's started goat rearing in their for initiation of income generation activities.
- Provided fish seeds to 245 beneficiary farmers who have their own farm pond in 89 villages of Yavatmal, Chandrapur and Gadchiroli districts.
- Improving learning outcomes of students under which covered more than 2000 students from Std 3 to 5 under E-learning class.
- 60 farmers have availed facility of irrigation through Phad who grown Gram and Wheat crops.
- Extended support to 192 deceased farmer's families in kind form.
- Encouraged more than 51203 farmers in 7 districts of Vidarbha, Marathwada and Western Maharashtra based on BCI, IPM, Organic & other technologies to increase crop productivity.



Key Achievements of the organization



Reached up to 78000 farmers from Yavatmal & Amravati district for quality improvements of Cotton crop production through Better Cotton (BC) Project



Motivated 1750 farmers from Yavatmal district for adoption of IPM, BMP practices. It improved crop income 25% by implementing this technique.



Motivated 3000 farmers from Yavatmal district for adoption of organic farming techniques.



Established 22 Farmer's Producer Companies in five districts Yavatmal, Wardha, Amravati, Chandrapur & Hingoli.



MREGS 72 villages, in six districts of Vidarbha Region



9477 beneficiary farmers were benefitted through NRM activity



Implemented SWC programme in 101 villages. 21 Crore liter water had been stored in different RWH structures constructed utilized for drinking & irrigation purpose.



147.81 Crore liters of water harvested in 6 district of Vidarbha Region Maharashtra



99.6 km length of Nalla had been Deepened & Wide.



Drought and Hailstorm Relief Activities carried out in 170 villages.

Promoted and bank linked about 700 SHG's in Ghatanji and Ralegaon blocks



Provided training to 300 youths for learning different Skill useful for employment & self-business.



30 ZP Schools were digitalized to create interest in more than 2000 students in learning and also to give good quality and innovative education to rural students.



1162 Children in 20 Primary Schools had improved their Marathi, English and Mathematics.



2820 students from 33 Government Ashram School were covered under Life Skill Training through Jeevan Sanskar Progame in Yavatmal District.



Vatslya Community Kitchen has been run for 19 Old age orphan peoples.
